## Make a new Start this January

If you have got questions about life and the Christian faith, then maybe it's time to make a *Start*. *Start* is a 6-week interactive course which explores some of life's big questions such as "Is there a God" and "If there is a God can I know him?". It is suitable for those who are exploring Christianity for the first time and those who need a refresher. It is ideal for those who are thinking about baptism and confirmation. The *Start* Course is normally run in groups of about 6 people, and each session involves video clips, exercises, discussion and time for reflection. Sessions lasts about an hour and it's free to attend. Keith and Janet Hale will be running the course at their home in Hoyland on Tuesday evenings at 7.30pm starting on 27<sup>th</sup> January (there will be a break during half term). ## Exploring faith through the senses

In November 2025, we applied to the Church of England for funding to create a Sensory Trail around the church, through the Disability Project Parish Grants Fund. We are delighted to announce that our bid was successful, and we have been awarded £2,540 to bring this project to life.

The Sensory Trail is designed to support people with sensory disabilities, physical disabilities, and those who are neurodiverse, while also offering an opportunity for people of all ages and abilities to explore faith through the senses.

The trail will include five sensory stations located within the church, focusing on sound, smell, taste, touch, and sight, as well as an all-senses nature station outside. We are hopeful that the trail will be up and running within the next few months.
