Draw Near to God

Believe it or not, we are now only a couple of weeks away from the start of the season of Lent. As many will know, Lent is the period of 40 days leading up to the commemoration of the death of Jesus on Good Friday and celebration of his resurrection at Easter. It is a time when we are all invited to draw closer to God and spend time thinking more deeply about what it means to follow Christ. The practice of observing what we now call Lent is rooted in the life of the earliest Christians. They spent the weeks leading up to Easter in fasting and abstinence to better focus on prayer, penitence, holiness and hope.

One of the ways we may choose to draw close to God is by reading and reflecting on passages from the Bible. The Church of England has produced some booklets of short Bible reflections which explore how we might build habits and patterns in our life that will help us draw near to God and grow as disciples. Each week a different contributor explores a different theme – worshipping together, praying, reading the Bible, sharing communion, offering service and sharing the good news with others. We will be ordering some booklets for church (priced £3 each). Please let Marie know if you would like a copy.

We will be marking the start of Lent on **Ash Wednesday 18th February** with a service of Holy Communion in Wentworth Church at 7pm. This will include the opportunity to receive the sign of the cross marked with ashes as a sign of penitence and turning to Christ. It is a moving ceremony in which all are invited to take part.

Visiting preacher

On Sunday 15th February we will be welcoming Beth Burras, Lead Lay Ministry Enabler for the Diocese of Sheffield as our guest preacher. Members of the Parochial Church Council and others met Beth in November when she facilitated an inspiring training event on the theme of Developing Lay Leaders. Beth will be speaking about how we can each play our part as members of Christ's body the church by contributing our gifts and talents.

Future plans

The PCC have agreed to engage the Church Architect to develop a plan for reordering the West end of church. For many years, we have struggled with a small kitchen and a small WC. The WC does not meet the requirements for an accessible toilet. The present kitchen/WC will be converted into two WC's one of which will be accessible and accommodate wheelchair users. A foldaway kitchenette will be developed along the South wall and be more than adequate for our catering requirements.

In addition, the Architect has been asked to look at remodelling the internal entrance porch of the main entrance. This storm porch has kept the drafts out for many years, but is now in much need of a full restoration.
